
Communities for Immunity Herd Immunity - Pop Its




To Do

Randomly "infect" one of the individuals by pushing down a pop-it. Marked pop-its are "vaccinated" so can't be infected. "Infect" adjacent (up, down, left, right) unvaccinated individuals by pushing them down.

Repeat infection step for all infected individuals until there are no more unvaccinated individuals adjacent to infected individuals

Mess Around

Try different pop-it board with different vaccination rates.



What's Going On

Vaccination protects not only the individual vaccinated but the people that individual interacts with. High levels of vaccination provide "herd immunity", providing some protection to the unvaccinated. The more easily a virus spreads, the more people need to be vaccinated to protect the unvaccinated.
