# Herd Immunity

## To Do



Distribute the balls with one in each hole. Gold balls are vaccinated individuals; white balls are unvaccinated. The blue ball is Patient Zero. Push down the blue ball.

“Infect” adjacent (up, down, left, right) unvaccinated individuals by pushing them down their holes. Repeat infection step for all infected individuals until there are no more unvaccinated individuals adjacent to infected individuals

## Mess Around

Change how close individuals should be to be infected, like also including diagonals. Do more people get infected?

## What's Going On

Vaccination protects not only the individual vaccinated but the people that individual interacts with. High levels of vaccination provide “herd immunity”, providing some protection to the unvaccinated. The more easily a virus spreads, the more people need to be vaccinated to protect the unvaccinated.

Are you vaccinated or do you commit to getting vaccinated? Put your initials on a yellow ball and swap it out for a white ball to help protect our virtual community!
